MINUTES BOARD OF EDUCATION April 13, 2009

The School Board of Beresford School District 61-2, Union County, Beresford, SD held their regular meeting at 6:00 p.m. at the south campus. A motion (M140-09) was made by Dennis McKelvey, and seconded by Ric Morren to approve a contract with Quam and Berglin to conduct the 2008-2009 audit. All present voted yes.

A motion (M141-09) was made by Ric Morren, and seconded by Doug Wevik to approve the following extra-curricular resignations:

Superintendent Field also informed the board the Emily Olson will no longer be serving as the cheerleading advisor and that a parent group will be taking over this responsibility.

A motion (M142-09) was made by Deb Bergland, and seconded by Shelby Docken to approve a contract in the amount of \$16,514 for Mike Radke to complete 2008-2009 school year as Interim Middle School Principal/Curriculum Director/Staff Development Coordinator. All present voted yes.

A motion (M143-09) was made by Dennis McKelvey, and seconded by Shelby Docken to approve a contract in the amount of \$2,422.00 for Kent Anderson to serve as an Assistant Track coach for the 2008-2009 school year. All present voted yes.

A motion (M144-09) was made by Doug Wevik, and seconded by Brad McCoy to approve the following 2009-2010 staff contracts:

Dustin Mees – Elementary Teacher \$28,775.00

Kathy Stuessi – Administrative Assistant \$11.00/per hour.

All present voted yes.

A motion (M145-09) was made by Ric Morren, and seconded by Dennis McKelvey to renew the food service management contract with Lunchtime Solutions for the 2009-2010 school year. All present voted yes.

A motion (M146-09) was made by Dennis McKelvey, and seconded by Brad McCoy to adopt a resolution (#09-02) authorizing the execution, terms, issuance, sale and payment of Limited Tax General Obligation Certificates in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$310,000 of the Beresford School District 61-2 of Clay, Lincoln, and Union Counties, South Dakota. All present voted yes. A copy of the resolution is on file at the Business Office. Superintendent Field informed the board that the bonds were all purchased by a local bank and the average coupon interest rate is 1.96%. The board appreciates the support received from the local purchase of the certificates.

A motion (M147-09) was made by Doug Wevik, and seconded by Deb Bergland to establish and supplement the track and field construction project fund as follows: FY 2009 Capital Outlay Certificate issued in the amount of \$310,000. FY 2010 Capital Outlay expenditures for Land Development in the amount of \$250,000. All present voted yes.

A motion (M148-09) was made by Shelby Docken, and seconded by Ric Morren to approve open enrollment application #O09-16. All present voted yes.

There was discussion in reference to ESA funding and the Beresford District participation in the services offered. The consensus of the board was to pursue the use of Federal Stimulus dollars and continue the districts participation.

Superintendent Field presented the board with an update on Capital Outlay projects and 5 Year Strategic Plan. Due to the sale of the capital outlay certificates, the 2009-2010 budget will have available dollars to include the purchase of band uniforms. The consensus of the board was to start the bid process for the purchase of band uniforms.

Administrative reports were given by Principals Radke, Lepke and Nelson.

Ric Morren led the discussion of chapter 6 from the book "Good to Great."

The review of the Self-Assessment of School Board Operations has been deferred to the May meeting.

At this time, the board took a 10 minute break and reconvened at 7:35 p.m.

A motion (M149-09) was made by Brad McCoy, and seconded by Shelby Docken to have the board go into executive session at 7:35 p.m. to discuss personnel matters. All present voted yes.

Executive session was declared over at 9:23 p.m.

A motion (M150-09) was made by Dennis McKelvey, and seconded by Shelby Docken to not renew the contract of Scott Klungseth as the head boys' basketball coach for the ensuing 2009-2010 school year. On Roll call vote: Deb Bergland, Ric Morren, Dennis McKelvey, Shelby Docken, and Doug Wevik voted yes. Brad McCoy and Sue Christensen voted no. Motion passed.

There being no further business, a motion (M151-09) was made by Deb Bergland, and seconded by Ric Morren to adjourn the meeting at 9:24 p.m. All present voted yes.
