Policy Committee - Sue Christensen

There was discussion and a first reading in reference to revising the Co-curricular Activities Code of Conduct Policy and a first reading on a Food Allergies Policy.

At this time the board broke for public input time.

The board resumed with a Budget Committee report given by Sue Christensen.

There was discussion in reference to the current condition of the buildings and grounds. A capital outlay 5-year strategic plan is being developed and the priorities will be determined by available funds. The committee is considering a change in the capital outlay levy to meet the districts needs concerning buildings and grounds. The final general fund opt-out tax payment will take place in the fall of 2008 and the committee's recommendation to the board is to not pursue another opt out due to the safe general fund reserve that is required to meet district obligations. The board also reviewed State regulations regarding the separation of general funds and capital outlay funds and how expenditures are legally defined for each account.

Administrative reports were given by Principals Limmer, Nelson, and Woodfield Center Director Namminga.

There being no further business, a motion (M58-08) was made by Dennis McKelvey, and seconded by Deb Bergland to adjourn the meeting at 7:45 p.m. All present voted yes.
