There was discussion on Initiative #10. A motion (M65-09) was made by Shelby Docken, and seconded by Dennis McKelvey to pass the following resolution:

INITIATED MEASURE 10 RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Beresford School District encourages active participation in the democratic process; and,

WHEREAS, the Beresford School District is an advocate for open and honest governance that is accountable to citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Beresford School District finds school board members throughout South Dakota are honest and ethical people acting for the best interests of the citizens and students they serve and the school districts they govern; and,

WHEREAS, South Dakota citizens will vote on Initiated Measure 10 in the November 2008 general election; and,

WHEREAS, Initiated Measure 10, if passed, will be challenged in court on the grounds that it violates the First, Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments of the United States Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, school board members and school administrators possess valuable insights and perspectives on how state education policy will impact students in local school districts; and,

WHEREAS, Initiated Measure 10 would prohibit any school district from paying dues to any association, group or individual that provides information to legislators and state government officials; and

WHEREAS, Initiated Measure 10, if passed, would eliminate an effective and efficient avenue for local government entities to coordinate communications with the Legislature and state government officials; and,

WHEREAS, civic groups who work to improve local communities often require local funding to provide community services; and,

WHEREAS, countless South Dakotans do business with state and local government entities; and,

WHEREAS, Initiated Measure 10, if passed, would place prohibitions on civic groups that receive any public funding and on those who do business with government entities by restricting their involvement in the political process;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that Beresford School District opposes Initiated Measure 10, and encourages voters throughout the state to 'VOTE NO' on Initiated Measure 10 in the November 2008 general election.

All present voted yes.

Superintendent Field presented the board with an update on Capital Outlay projects and 5 Year Strategic Plan. There was also discussion concerning the 2009 HVAC, roofing, tucking pointing projects and repairs to the football/track and field complex and stadium.

There were no committee reports.

An administrative report was given by Principal Lepke.

At this time, the board took a 5 minute break and reconvened at 7:45 p.m.

A motion (M66-09) was made by Ric Morren, and seconded by Brad McCoy to have the board go into executive session at 7:46 p.m. to discuss student and personnel matters. All present voted yes.

Executive session was declared over at 8:47 p.m.

There being no further business, a motion (M67-09) was made by Doug Wevik, and seconded by Brad McCoy to adjourn the meeting at 8:47 p.m. All present voted yes.
